Your Guide to Belmont World Film's 17th Annual Family Festival

Leave the distractions of home and enjoy some of the world's most exciting films for children age 3-12 on the big screen—films that open children up to the lives of children in other countries, enabling them to gain an understanding of and sensitivity towards people of different cultures.

Since many programs are based on classic and contemporary children's books—from both the US and abroad—they help reinforce an interest in reading and literature, while complementing the Massachusetts Public School System's Curriculum Frameworks. For children who can't read yet or have difficulty reading subtitles, we are pleased to offer simultaneous live narration in English via headphones for films in other languages.

Each day is devoted to a different theme: Saturday's films focus mainly on animals, Sunday features all short films programs, and Monday is devoted to learning how to make peace and friends. We've created some age guidelines that you'll find marked on each film program or live event. Children mature at different ages, however, and you know your children best.

Programs for Children Age 2-6: The Very Hungry Caterpillar Show Storytime is mostly live and geared to young audiences. It includes opportunities for audience participation. After the program ends, children can choose to be photographed with the caterpillar puppet.

Programs for Children Age 3-9: Appropriate programs for this age group include What's New From Weston Woods Studios, Laugh Out Loud with Mo Willems, and Zog/The Snail and the Whale program, which are are presented in English and limited to one hour. They are best enjoyed by those who may not wish to read subtitles or do not wish to hear them read out loud through headphones. It is not uncommon for children to leave prior to the end of the program, if they feel tired or uncomfortable.

Programs for Children Age 5+: Besides the "Learn to Draw Minions" workshop on Saturday, appropriate programs in this group include Jacob, Mimmi and the Talking Dogs, Abominable, "It's Easy Being Green", Honoring Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and Animated & Adorable. Programs range from 70 to 90 minutes and may require the ability to read subtitles.

Programs for Children 9+: Besides the "Learn to Create Storyboards for Animated Films" workshop on Sunday, appropriate programs in this group include **Hacker, Arctic Camels, Mila, My Grandpa Is an Alien**, and **Binti**. They contain more mature themes with realistic scenes, but some children as young as 7 may be interested in these films.

Meet this year's Artist-in-Residence

We are pleased to welcome **Cinzia Angelini**, a writer, story artist, and director with an unbridled passion for all types of animation, as this year's Artist-in-Residence.

She wrote and is currently directing *Mila*, a high-quality CG short film about a girl whose life takes an unexpected turn during World War II. It is being produced by the largest independent, worldwide virtual studio collaboration ever, consisting of 350 volunteer animation professionals from 35 countries. With Cinesite's Vancouver animation studio joining the production team, it is set to be released in summer 2020. Her innovative collaboration on *Mila* led to invitations to speak at TEDx Trento in 2017 and TEDx Vail in 2018, where she introduced her idea of bridging cultural diversity through the magic of animation.



Originally from Italy, Cinzia moved to Los Angeles and has worked as a 2D/3D animator and story artist for studios such as Dreamworks, Sony Imageworks, Walt Disney Animation, Warner Bros, and Illumination Entertainment during her 25 year career in the animation industry. She is currently Head of Story at Cinesite Studios and is working on an upcoming animated feature film inspired by the legendary filmmaker Harold Lloyd. Her work includes the recently released *Abominable, The Minions Movie, Despicable Me 3, Spider-Man 2, The Grinch, Balto, Prince of Egypt, Eldorado, Spirit, Sinbad, Open Season, Meet the Robinsons*, and Bolt.




