Overdose Signs & Symptoms

If you witness someone experiencing any of these symptoms, please call 911 immediately.

- Unconscious
- Unresponsive
- Severe difficulty breathing, shallow breaths or complete absence of breathing
- Gurgling sounds (snoring) that indicate a person's airway may be blocked
- Blue Lips or Fingers
- Vomiting
- Seizure/Convulsions
