# Your Guide to Belmont World Film's 19th & Online Family Festival



Travel the world with your children—either in-person or online—with some of the most exciting international films for children age 3-12 today. You and your children can also engage in hands-on workshops that will turn them into clay model makers and junior film critics!

This year's festival features three in-person screenings: Laura's Star, My Dad Is a Sausage and Calamity, a Childhood of Martha Jane Cannary (My Dad Is a Sausage and Calamity, a Childhood of Martha Jane Cannary will also be available for screening online). The requirements for in-person screenings and workshops include proof of vaccination or a negative Covid test within 48 hours of the event, wearing masks at all times, and social distancing.

Several programs are based on classic and contemporary children's books, which helps reinforce an interest in reading and literature, while complementing the Massachusetts Public School System's Curriculum Frameworks. For children who can't read yet or have difficulty reading subtitles, there are several programs in English, and subtitles will be read aloud through headphones at in-person screenings.

To help maximize your children's enjoyment of the festival, we've created some age guidelines below. Children mature at different ages, however, and you know your children best.


