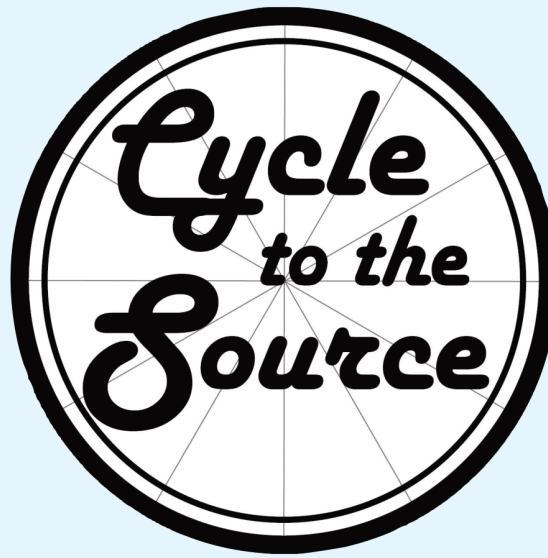

What is it? Cycle to the Source is a 32-mile bike tour of the Cambridge Watershed. It is a chance to explore where your water comes from, how it is collected, and what steps are taken to ensure the city has clean drinking water. It will include stops at the upper reservoirs, dams, gatehouses, and the CWD field office.

Where is it? The ride starts and ends at the Walter J. Sullivan Purification Facility at 250 Fresh Pond Parkway, and explores the Cambridge watershed, which includes the lands and reservoirs in Lincoln, Lexington, Weston, and Waltham.

How do I register? This bike ride is free and open to the public. Advanced registration is required. Go to <https://www.tinyurl.com/CycleToTheSource2023>. Registration closes on September 27th. For safety reasons, this event is for adults only. Priority for spots will be given to Cambridge residents and first-time participants.
